### PURPOSE, EXPECTATIONS, AND GUIDELINES



- To give our students an opportunity to serve in a ministry setting

# PREACHING & TEACHING INSTRUCTIONS

THE ROLE OF "RESCUE"

### MORE THAN A SERMON...

#### PREACHING A SERMON

 You come and deliver a 20-30 minute talk for our students

#### **LEADING A SERVICE**

- You prayerfully plan the entire hour.
- You **bring a worship team** (and sing familiar songs).
- Students leave with some simple key takeaways.
- Careful use of scripture to support a big idea – less scrolling and more personal testimony and application.
- You offer to **pray with people** at the end (and bring others to pray with you)!
- BONUS: Bring a small group to provide treats at the close of chapel!

### WHAT RESONATES...

- Songs they know and can sing along to.

  Tip: Just Google "Top 20 Worship Songs for 2019-2021" and you'll get a great list!
- Sermons based on your own real-life experience (addiction, grief and loss, incarceration, abandonment, depression, physical pain and suffering, isolation, family conflict) and how you overcame your struggles with God's help. Keep in mind "appropriate vulnerability".
- When you relate to them on their level -- where they are -- and not with condescending or patronizing messages. Don't call out their sin or plead for repentance rather help them overcome their shame/guilt by encouraging them to embrace the deep LOVE of Christ.
- A loving invitation to a turning point -- actions for every level of faith. Not just salvation! "Step closer to the urgency of the mission of Jesus", "Come back to your first love/good shepherd, "Stop living in bondage of guilt and shame", etc.

# THEMES THAT CAN ALWAYS STAND REPEATING

- God is who He says He is.
- God can do what He says He can do.
- You are who God says you are.
- You can do all things through Christ Jesus who strengthens you.
- God's word is alive and active in YOU!

Believing God is different than believing IN God.

### **CONSIDER YOUR AUDIENCE**

#### A wide range of spiritual maturity levels...

- Non-believers, atheists, skeptics
- No church background at all
- Mature believers
- Misguided believers (warped view of God from childhood)

#### ... so, let your worship and message reflect this.

- Don't assume they know a story from the Bible
- Educate them on the Bible itself; how it's laid out, difference between Old and New Testament, how to read/study it, different translations, etc.
- Don't assume they've ever been to church before. Explain why we do certain things like pray/serve/give, what talking to God looks like, why we call Jesus our friend, etc.
- Go light on the volume of Scripture you read and heavier on your personal testimony and application (simplicity is key)
- Invite them into actions that are relevant to where they might be in their faith.
- A lot of underlying trauma (including spiritual trauma), mental illness, addiction and/or abuse. Encourage and empower them in their journey to healing and wholeness.

Traumatic stress can deeply influence our students/guests' ability to hear and respond to the hope of the Gospel.

# CREATING A TRAUMA-INFORMED ENVIRONMENT

We are committed to creating a safe, predictable, nonthreatening, environment where our students and guests can learn about God in a respectful and non-coercive or manipulative manner.

### GENERAL GUIDELINES

#### Chapel is a time to worship, praise and uplift.

- We welcome messages of love, hope, and encouragement, rooted in the Gospel message of salvation through Jesus Christ.
- Only the fundamental doctrines of the Christian faith are to be taught. Teachings specific to your denomination are not permitted.
- Baptisms are not to be conducted.
- Communion is not to be conducted without prior permission.
- Do not invite our students to "pray you in or out".
- Please seek permission prior to giving anything to students (gifts, clothing, bookmarks, certificates, mementos, etc.). NO CASH!
- Abide by the San Diego Rescue Mission's Statement of Faith

# ADDITIONAL SENSITIVITIES AND PRACTICAL REMINDERS

- Taking pictures/videos of the men and women is strictly prohibited. Please communicate this to your entire team beforehand.
- No physical touch (even in prayer or sermon illustrations) without permission.
- Avoid "scare tactics" or messages of condemnation.
- No "hellfire and brimstone."
- Watch your sound levels no yelling/slamming of furniture/or roaming the aisles to illustrate a point.
   No super loud music.
- Please seek permission from advocate before mentoring students one-on-one or taking them off Mission property.

# WHEN STUDENTS ATTEND YOUR CHURCH...

While we encourage them to attend your church to establish a support network, please remember they are still in recovery.

Therefore, do not pressure them to:

- Tithe when they get a job, There are many extenuating, confidential circumstances around their management of money of which you may not be aware.
- Serve in a volunteer or staff capacity without first checking with their SDRM Advocate. Many of our students are still in classes at the Mission and until they complete them, they will not be able to commit to outside commitments, even though they think they can.

# TRANSPORTING STUDENTS TO YOUR CHURCH

At present, our students travel in groups to 4 local churches on Sundays.

We currently **do not** have any vans/drivers available to drive students to other churches.

However, if you would like to pick up students from the Mission, bring them to your church and return them after your service, please reach out to Ashley.

### THE SCHEDULE

### HOW THE SCHEDULE WORKS

- We book the Chapel Schedule three months out:
  - QI schedule was sent out mid-December (for Jan-Mar)
  - Q2 schedule will be sent out mid-March (for April June),
  - Q3 schedule will be sent out mid-June (for July September)
  - Q4 schedule will be sent out mid-September (for Oct Dec)
- We will send you a reminder within a week of your scheduled date.
- It is YOUR responsibility to review the schedule and either put it on your calendar (commit) or request a new date.
- Please do not wait until the week prior to cancel/reschedule.
- Begin securing your worship team as soon as the schedule comes out.



### EXPECTATIONS

### WHAT WE EXPECT FROM YOU

- Come with a worship team and LEAD (vs. perform) worship!
  - From one worship singer and a guitar/piano to a full band (please no a cappella or Youtube videos).
  - As we add new churches to our rotation, we may not have room in our schedule for churches that can't bring worship
- Instructions for song/Scripture slides to our sound team at least 24 hours prior (or on Friday for Sunday services)
- Show up on time (6:00 pm)
- Let us know at least two weeks out if you cannot make your date
- If you are thinking of bringing a replacement speaker, please tell us 2 weeks prior so we can onboard the speaker with all the appropriate training, agreement forms and compliance. Speakers must have extensive experience and full pastoral support. No last-minute speaker changes please.

# TYPICAL CHAPEL SERVICE FORMAT

- 6:00pm Pastor and Worship Team arrive to set up and sound check
- 6:45pm Chapel service begins, SDRM host (CLA) opens in prayer
  - 3 Worship songs with lyrics on screen, everyone invited to stand
  - Scripture reading
  - 20-25 minute sermon ending in prayer
  - Closing song, blessing/benediction
- 7:45pm Service ends
  - Fellowship, prayer, snacks if provided
- 8:00pm Everyone departs and chairs are reset for the morning

Wed. services: Due Tuesday by noon Sunday services: Due Friday by noon

- Pastoral referral
